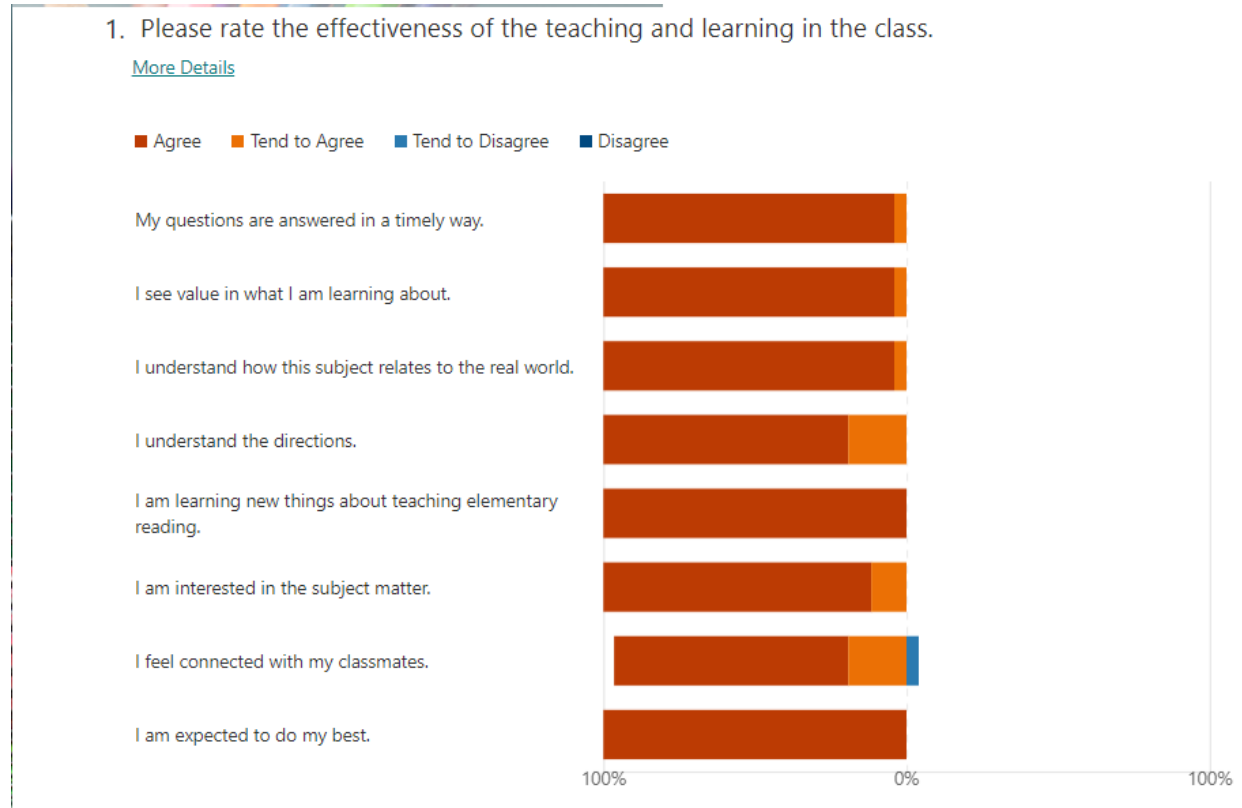

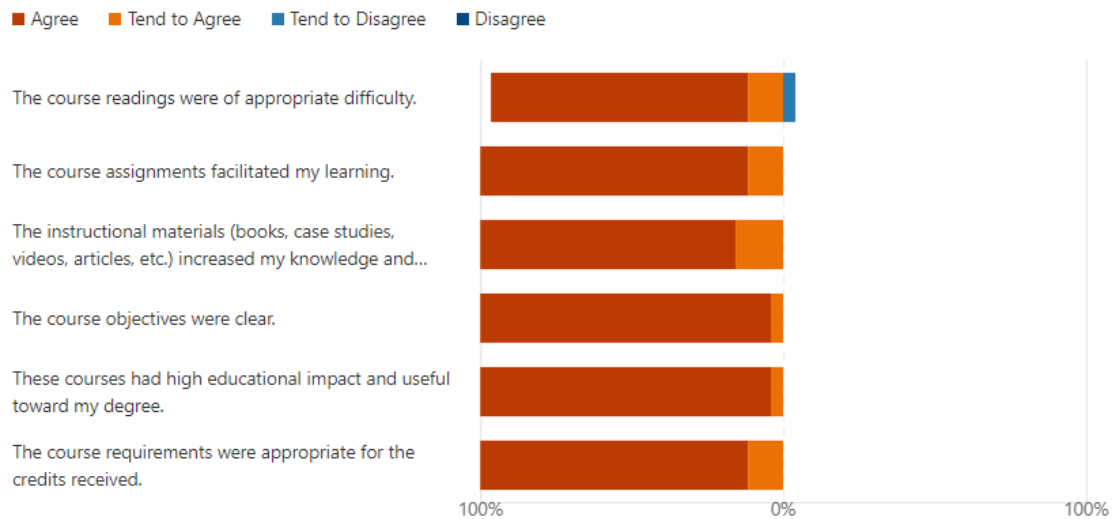

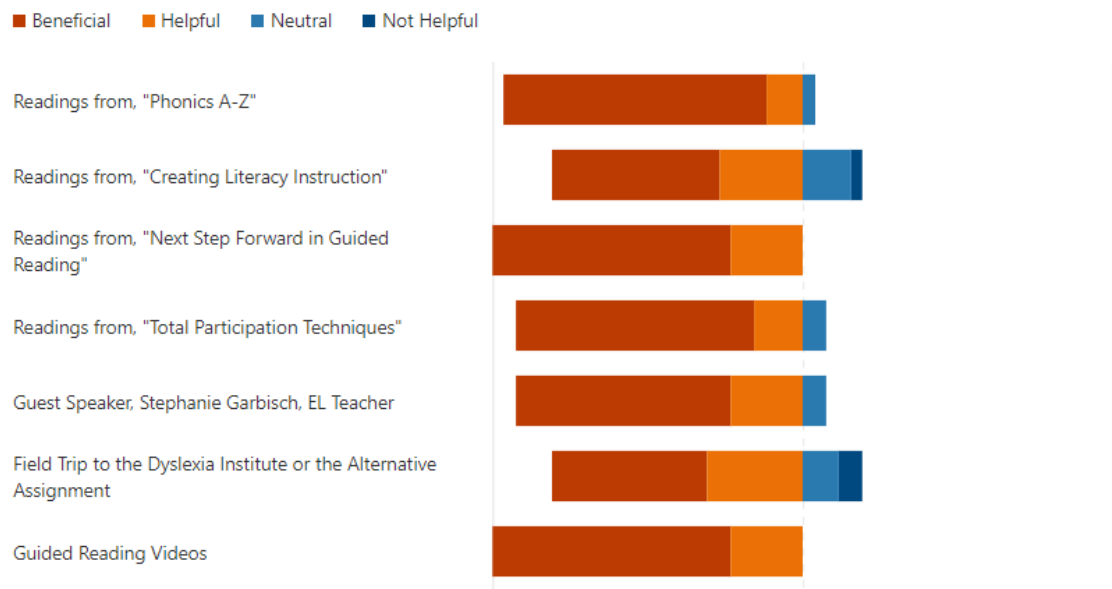
2. Please rate the effectiveness of the courses, RED 310 & 410 .

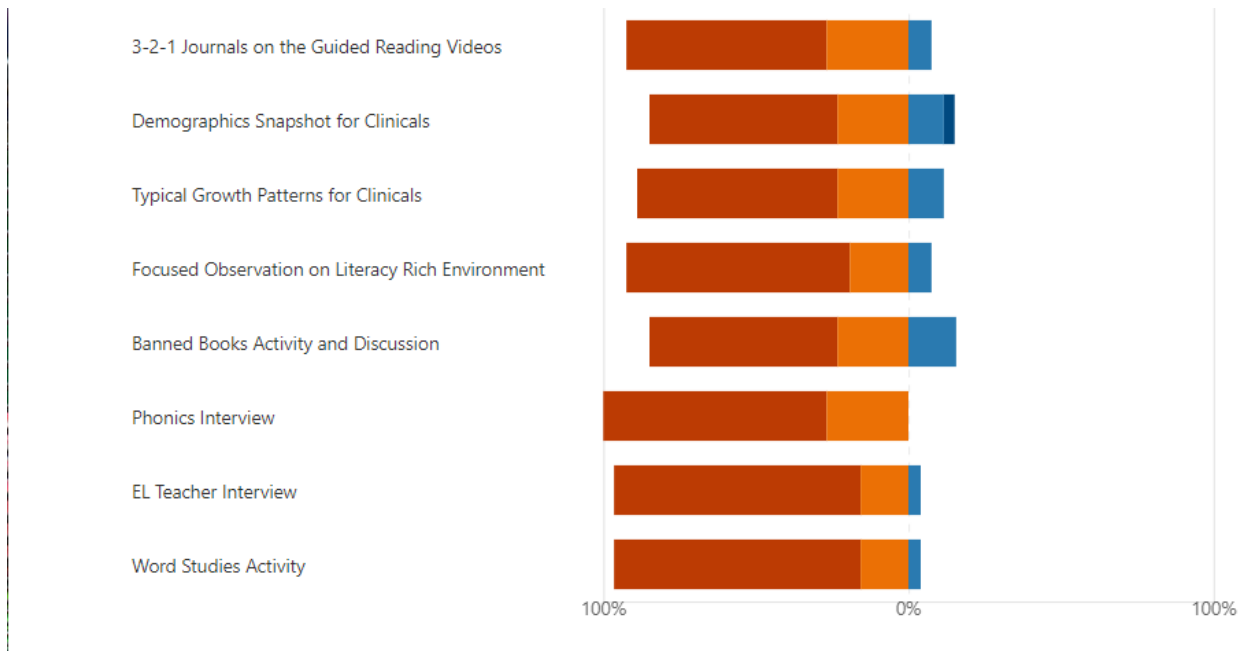
